Mahan Completes ODOT Delaware County Slide Repair Ahead of Schedule

C.J. Mahan Construction Company, LLC re-entered the Ohio Department of Transportation market on April 17, 2015 when they were awarded Project 158007 in the amount of \$1,405,214.55 to repair a slipping slope in Delaware County, Ohio. Mahan, who had not worked for ODOT since 2008, started work in Delaware County on June 7, 2015. The project was an unquestionable success, with Mahan completing the project on budget and one weak ahead of schedule, on August 7, 2015.

The project consisted of securing the slipping hillsides at Ohio State Route 315 and 750 in Southern Delaware County, Ohio. The slipping was caused by the Olentangy River moving towards the roadway and eroding the slope that supports SR 315. The slipping hillside was stabilized using the shotcrete method which was selected by ODOT so that the repaired area could be sculpted to create a tiered, natural textured look closely resembling the shale and rock material present at this intersection rather than the unappealing look of a 20-foot tall concrete retaining wall.
