Virginia Route 460 Project Reaches Safety Milestone

On November 26, 2013, C.J. Mahan Construction Company, LLC (Mahan) celebrated the milestone of reaching 170,022 man hours without a recordable injury on its Virginia Route 460 Connector Project. This achievement represents nearly a year's worth of work on the Project, which is being praised by Virginia Governor Bob McDonnell for its role of bringing more jobs and business opportunities to southwestern Virginia. The route is designated as part of "Corridor Q" by the Appalachian Regional Commission and part of the Appalachian Development Highway System, a program originally envisioned by President Lyndon B. Johnson to bring commerce and transportation to Appalachia.

Mahan is working as the bridge subcontractor on the Virginia Route 460 Connector Project. The design-build, best value structure includes a 1,728' long twin cast-in-place segmental bridge with trapezoidal box superstructure, segmental spans of 268.5' x 489' x 489', and 268.5' plus two precast concrete girders with spans of 110' and 103', and unique H-shaped pier columns with heights in excess of 200'. When complete in November 2014, the bridge will be the tallest in the state of Virginia.

To mark this safety milestone, Mahan sponsored a luncheon for the entire Project crew to acknowledge their effort and determination that led to this safety achievement.
